

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# PE at Clapgate

At Clapgate Primary, we are passionate about PE and strive to develop a lifelong love of exercise amongst all our children. This is shown through our achievement of Platinum in the Schools Games Mark Award. What makes us unique is our highly-skilled, specialist PE teacher, who is lucky enough to work across all classes in school to deliver a broad and balanced PE curriculum. We also work with local clubs to provide high quality teaching for our children and training for our staff including Leeds United Foundation and Hunslet Rugby Club.

We offer an extensive variety of extra-curricular clubs, with something to appeal everyone, including: boxing, football, rugby, gymnastics, dance, team games and many more. We are very proud of our school teams and have celebrated lots of success, most recently with our U9's Football team winning the 2022-2023 league. We have also had children through to the Cross Country city wide Leeds final. We are constantly participating in events to provide a range of opportunities for our pupils including BMX events, dodgeball, ice skating, dance and many more.

We offer our children lots of excellent provision within school time too, including Bikeability sessions, Outdoor Adventurous Activities (OAA) days at West Leeds in which they go-kart, climb and abseil alongside visits to the skate park at LS10. We have bikes and scooters for Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 and have a range of adventure playgrounds for the children to access at breaks and lunchtimes. Our Year 5 and 6 Mini Leaders deliver games for all year groups during lunchtimes to increase activity levels and provide further sporting opportunities. We also work with Total Dance who provide provision twice a week over lunchtimes focusing upon dance and archery!

All our children enjoying participating in Sport and Health Week, where they get to try lots of new sports and activities and look at ways to improve their eating choices and adapt their exercise routines to stay fit. One of the main highlights of our school year is the 'Teachers Versus Kids' - the teachers are proud to currently hold the title as champions!

Not only is PE provision at our school excellent, we encourage the development of all our key attributes through our teaching of this subject, ensuring lessons are fun and challenging, and

that our children make fantastic progress. Children problem solve, work as a team and support their peers, leading to well rounded individuals not just in sport bit in all areas of their

# The Arts at Clapgate



At Clapgate we value the arts. Art, music and drama are an integral part of our school curriculum. The arts are taught as distinct subjects in a skills-based manner. Experimentation, risk and innovation are actively encouraged. A great deal of time and energy is focused on the creative journeys that children explore. Our intention is to create confident, independent artists who can articulate and value their own creative journeys whether that in art, music, drama or dance.

We are fortunate to have a specialist art teacher and the fantastic facility of a large, well-resourced art room where children can use a variety of materials to explore their ideas and creativity. Children from reception up to year 6 can work in this fabulous environment exploring: painting, drawing, textiles, printing, sculpture, and collage.

In Harmony Operorth delivers an inclusive programme of high quality music education and performance opportunities from reception through to Year 6. In Harmony music lessons encourage our children to engage with the arts and benefit from a range of personal, social and musical outcomes. The programme promotes musical excellence and provides development pathways for committed and enthusiastic young people to realise their music potential. Music lessons take place weekly. Reception and KS1 have musicianship lessons. UKS2 have choir lessons and string instrumental lessons. USK2 have string and brass instrument lessons. Extra-curricular lessons in music include choir, string and brass instruments for KS2 children. All children perform to family members every term.

Our children are fantastic performers and drama is at the heart of our curriculum, with children enjoying regular Imagineering sessions as well as teachers using a range of drama tools effectively in lessons. We have a great working relationship with 'Alive and Kicking' and have developed specialist units with them for our children. A highlight of the year is our (West End standard!) musical production which takes place in the theatre at Cockburn High School with full lights, costumes and special effects. Our younger children also get the opportunity to perform in a Christmas show, which is greatly received by audiences.

We believe strongly in our arts provision and in June 2022 we achieved the Artsmark Gold Award. Artsmark is the Arts Council England's flagship programme which enables schools to evaluate, strengthen and celebrate their arts and cultural provision. Artsmark contributes to the cultural aspect of Ofsted's requirement that a 'school promotes students' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development.' Our school Arts Council plays a huge part in creating arts opportunities for all pupils including visits, artists working in school, enterprise, creating, editing and publishing a termly arts magazine and community events.

# The Great Outdoors

We are extremely proud of the extensive grounds we have at Clapgate. They provide our children with of plenty space to run around at playtime and lunchtime, promoting exercise and a healthy lifestyle. Each Key Stage has their own playground which is equipped with trim trails and playground markings to keep children active.

We understand the importance of being outside and the positive effect it has on our mental health and wellbeing. Our outdoor area is an extension of our classroom, and this provides our children with a wealth of learning opportunities such as exploring, experimenting, problemsolving and negotiating risk, which we know allows our students to become well-rounded individuals. Come rain or shine, our children are encouraged to be outside, and this is why we have provided enough waterproofs and wellies to ensure that outdoor lessons go ahead whatever the weather.

Both our Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 fields have an allotment space with raised beds for each class to grow fruit and vegetables. We have a wooded area that provides opportunities for bug hotels and den building; the campfire section is perfect for reading stories, toasting marshmallows and developing those all-important oracy skills. An orchard consists of pear, apple, plum and cherry trees, whilst the outdoor classroom provides an area for children to focus, socialise or use to enjoy a good book amongst nature.

The main attraction to the outdoor area at Clapgate is our animals. We have chickens who can peck freely, on the top field, all day long and they provide us with free-range eggs, and we have our characterful Pygmy goats, Pablo and Pedro! We have goat keepers who volunteer to look after the goats and play with them every lunch time, whilst classes take it in turns each week to clean and feed the chickens and the goats on a twice daily basis. This gives the children a huge responsibility and sense of looking after important members of the Clapgate family.

"I love being outside in the allotment because we can grow our own plants and think about healthy recipes to cook with our produce," Year 5 pupil.

"Now we have an outdoor classroom and campfire area, we have exciting places to listen to stories or create our own. Being outside makes me feel happy and it helps me use my imagination with freedom," Year 4 pupil.







# Therapeutic Team

At Clapgate Primary School we recognise the significance of nurturing the whole child, placing high importance on children feeling happy, safe and ready to learn.

The therapeutic team is made up of skilled professionals, who have introduced a range of approaches and interventions to promote positive mental health and well-being, emotional literacy and the development of social skills. This is done on a whole school level and in small groups or 1:1 for children who need additional support.

We are well resourced with a large therapeutic room where small group work and 1:1 work takes place. Children who may be feeling stressed or unhappy can join an opportunity to talk about uncomfortable feelings. We also have a smaller safe space for children who need their own quiet space away from others, with a soft floor and calming lighting.

## **Admissions**



Prospective parents are strongly encouraged to phone or email for an appointment to meet the headteacher or other senior leader and view the school. We do not have a specific 'Open Day'; please come on a 'normal' school day and see what we have to offer!

Your child can start in our Nursery from the age of three. When there is space, we can admit children in the half term in which they become three ('rising threes'). If our Nursery is over-subscribed, the admission criteria follow the criteria for the rest of school. These are:

- Children with EHCs
- Children looked after
- Children with acute medical or mobility needs
- Children with siblings already in school
- Distance nearest first





Places in full time Reception classes (from age 4) are allocated by Leeds City Council. Details can be found here:

The 'application window' is usually November to early January for a place the following September.

Every child can learn, and every child deserves the opportunity to reach their potential. At Clapgate, we recognise that not all children learn in the same way, and we are committed to removing barriers to learning to ensure that everybody is included.

For some children, specialist support is needed. We strive to meet any child's special educational needs wherever possible and offer a wide range of resources and provision, including a Speech and Language Therapist who works with us for one day per week.

Our staff are skilled in identifying children who require additional support and work closely with the

SENDCo to devise appropriate plans to secure progress. We work with several outside agencies to provide specialist support for children with more significant needs.

## Partnership with Parents

Twice a year (in the autumn and spring term) you will be invited to meet with your child's teacher to discuss his/her progress at a parent's evening. You will also receive an annual written report about your child in the summer term. At all other times, if you have any questions or concerns, you are welcome to come into school and meet with the class teacher, the headteacher, the SENDCo, the child and family support worker or the therapeutic team lead.

Teachers send out a half termly class newsletter and there is also a weekly school newsletter The Clapgate Courier). We also keep in regular contact with you through the school website and Arborl.

We love to have our parents in school, being part of the children's learning and sharing in celebrating their achievements. Every half term, the teachers invite the parents to join the children in 'parental involvement' events. These events have included activities such as building houses that the big bad wolf can't blow down, taking part in debates, joining in with a super spelling afternoon' and creating the international space station from the scrap shed materials. Every Friday, parents are also invited to join our weekly 'celebration' assembly.

We encourage parents to help in school both in and out of the classroom in a variety of ways. Any help, whether it is a single gesture or a regular occurrence, is highly valued by the staff as there is always something to do in our busy school! # **Practical Information**



## The School Day

Nursery full day sessions: 8.55-3.15 (half day session on Wednesdays 8.55-11.25/12.45-3.15)

Reception: 8.45-3.15pm

Key Stage 1 and 2: 8.50-3.20pm

Registration closes at 9.00am. For Reception to Year 6

#### **School Uniform**

All children from Nursery to Year 6 wear school uniform.

They can wear:

- A purple or grey jumper, sweatshirt or cardigan
- A white, purple or grey school shirt, blouse or polo shirt
- Grey or black trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore dress
- Grey or black jogging bottoms for children in Foundation Stage



PE kit is a white or purple t-shirt, black leggings or shorts and a pair of trainers or pumps. For outdoor PE, all children will need suitably warm clothing and footwear depending on the time of year and activity. Please ensure all clothing is clearly labelled.

Jewellery is not allowed in school for reasons of safety and security. However, children may wear a watch and if they have pierced ears, one or a pair of plain studs or sleepers only. Larger earrings of any type are not allowed in school. Earrings may be 'taped' during PE lessons.

Children are encouraged to bring wellies when it is wet and sun cream and sunhats when it is sunny.

All items can be sourced from school uniform shops or supermarkets.

#### Medication

Please inform the school office if your child has any allergies that you have not previously told us

about on the admissions information form. Prescription medication or other medication such as Calpol, will be administered as required.

A form must be completed in the office prior to leaving any medication in school.

#### **Active Club**

We run a daily active club for children before school from 8.00. This is run by school staff and £3.00 per day from 8.00am and £2.00 from 8.30am. Places must be be booked in advance on Arbor.

#### **School Dinners**

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to universal free school meals. Children in Nursery or Key Stage 2 will need to pay for dinners unless they are eligible for benefits related free school meals. All dinners must be pre-ordered and paid for (when applicable) through Arbor The price of meals in Nursery is £2.17 and the price in Key Stage 2 is £2.55 There are normally four dinner choices. If the balance on the School Meal Account reaches -£30.00 in arrears, you would then be expected to bring a packed lunch for your child until this balance is paid.

#### Milk and Fruit

Under the government's School Fruit and Vegetable Scheme, children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1

and Year 2 receive a free piece of fruit or a vegetable in school each day. Children up to the age of five and those children who are entitled to benefits related free school meals are entitled to free school milk. For children over five and not entitled to benefits related free school meals, milk costs £18 per term (£54 for the year).

#### **Newsletters**

A newsletter will be sent out via Arbor every half term to inform you of the topics that covered and upcoming events in your child's class. There will also be a weekly whole school newsletter - the Clapgate Courier.

### Communication

We are a paperless school and all our letters, trip information and permissions, club information, dinner information and admissions information go through Arbor. This will also be the method that you will use to pay for school trips, residentials, dinners and paid clubs. This is a secure, effective way of communicating with you and allowing you to make payments. When your child is admitted to our school, we will require an email address so that you can be set up on Arbor. We can support you with this in school if you are having any difficulties with the system.

We also use Facebook. Keep up to date with the latest school news by adding Clapgate Primary on Facebook.

The website is also a source of information such as newsletters and other letters home, information about the curriculum, links to learning websites, school policies and examples of children's work.

Please inform the school if your child is absent. Parents/carers should ring school before 9.30 on the first day of absence or send a message through Arbor. Our attendance officer Aimee Stamp (stampa@clapgateprimaryschool.org) will ring or email the parents of any child that is not in school if we have not heard from you as part of our safeguarding procedures. If we haven't had any contact about a child's absence in 2 days, then a home visit will take place. We place great importance on good attendance at Clapgate. Children should aim to be in school for at least 96% of the time (this equates
